

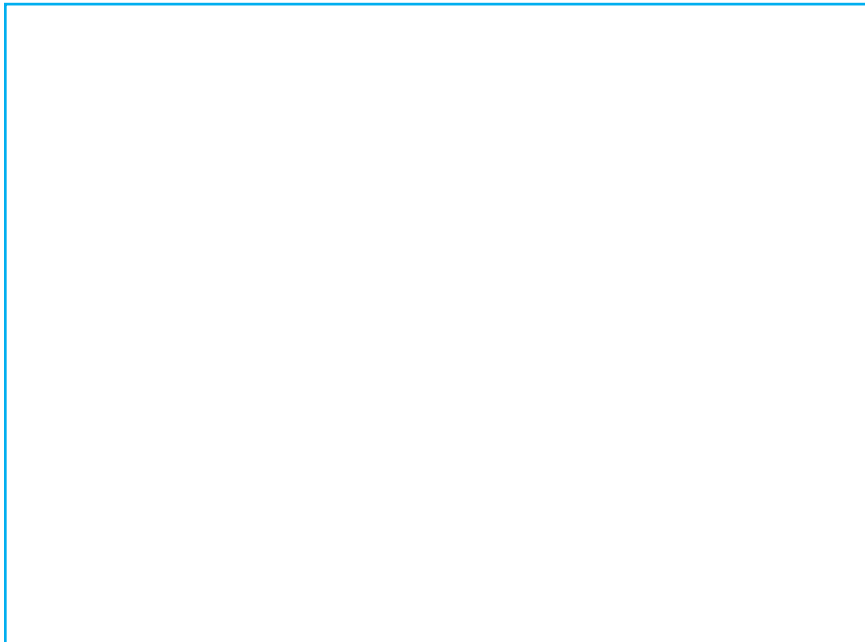

The Slow Death of Rocks

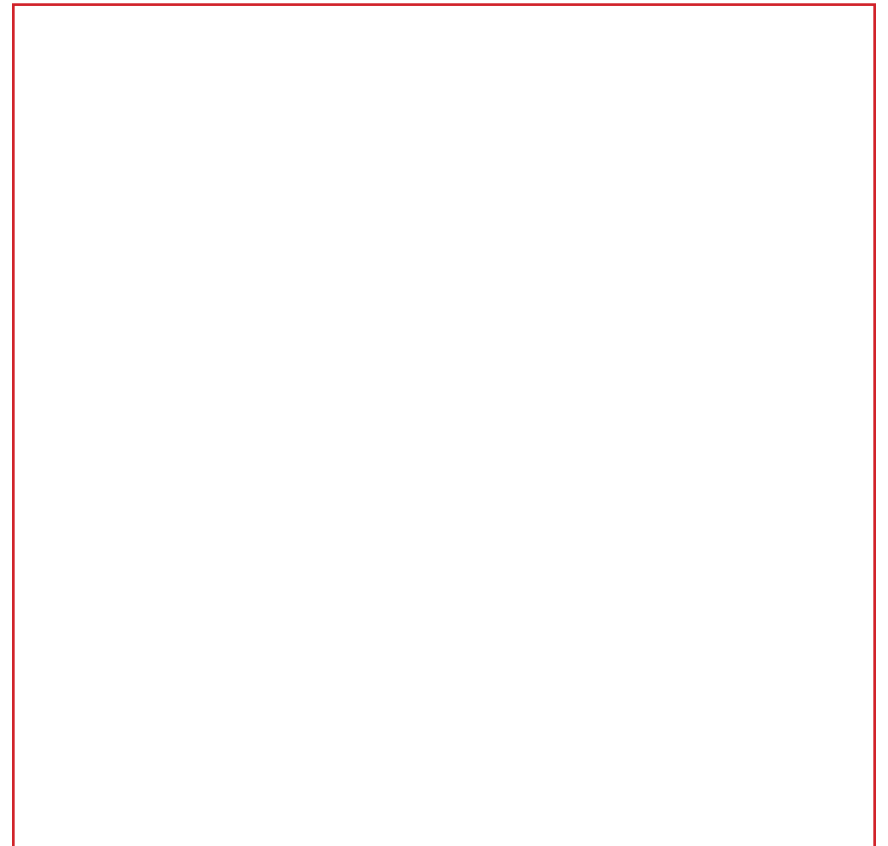


For this show, Doug Young made paintings that feature moths and crystals in different formations. Can you draw your own moth below?

Can you find this painting by Beatrix Ost, called *The Interpretation of Dreams*? Try to imagine the dream this painting came from! Draw or describe it here.

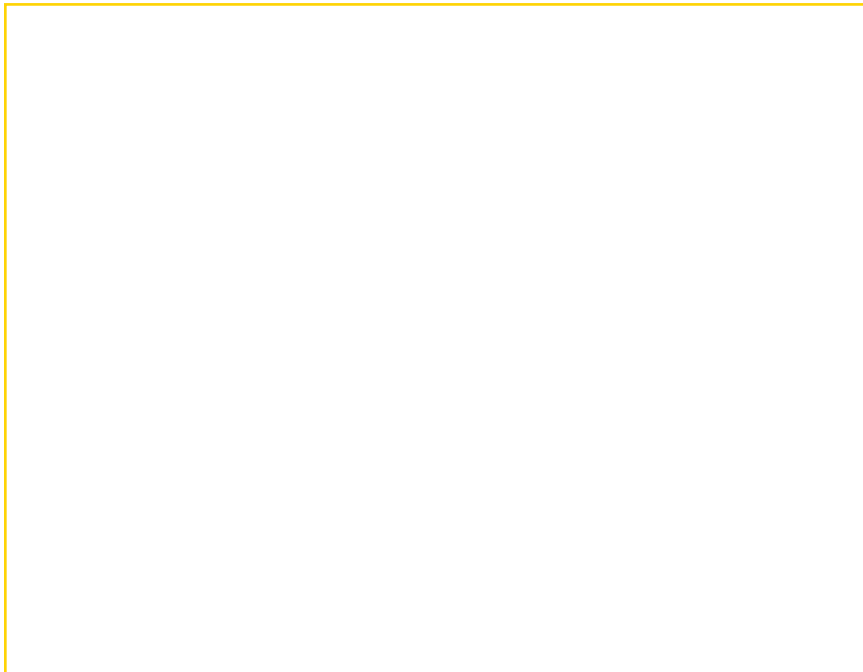

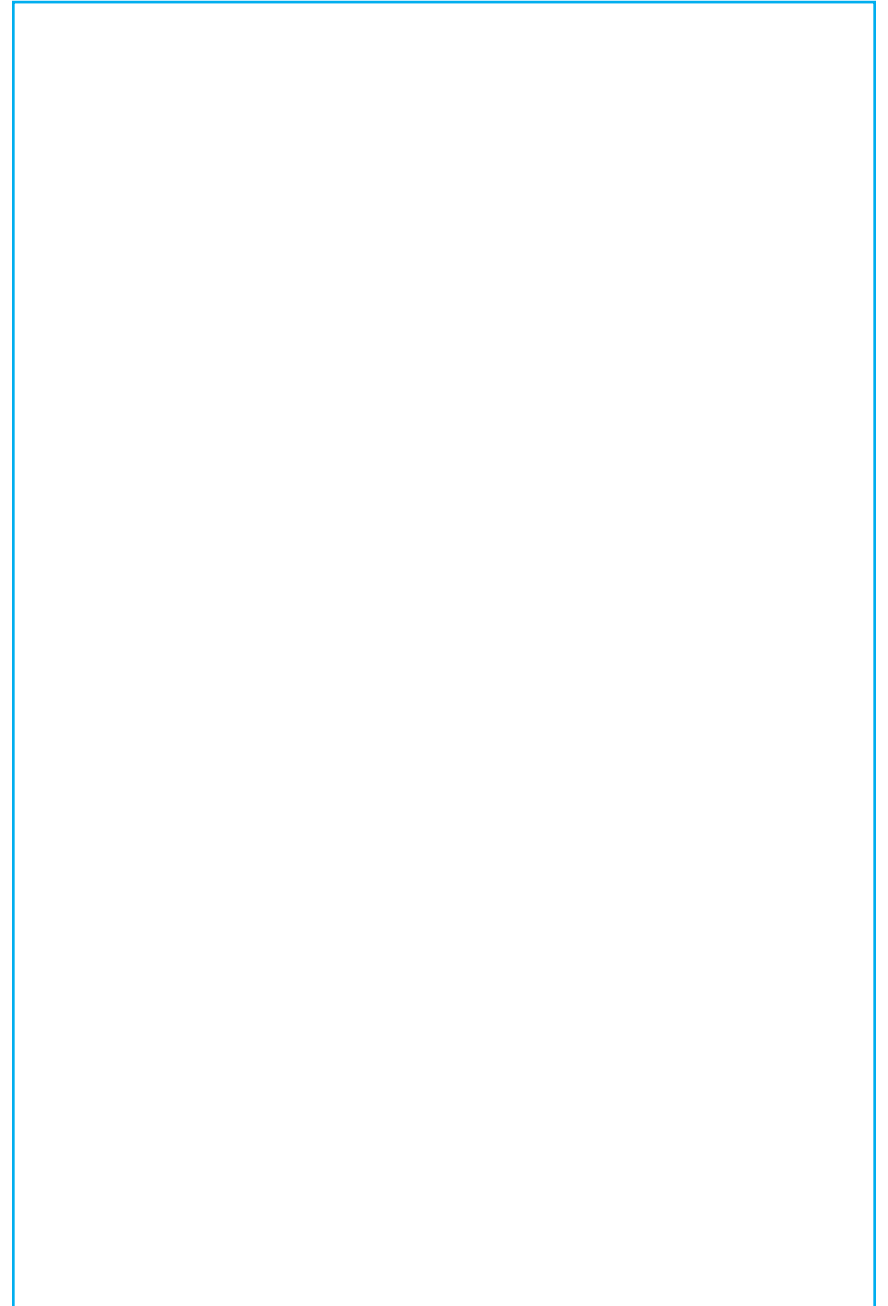
Illuminations & Illusions

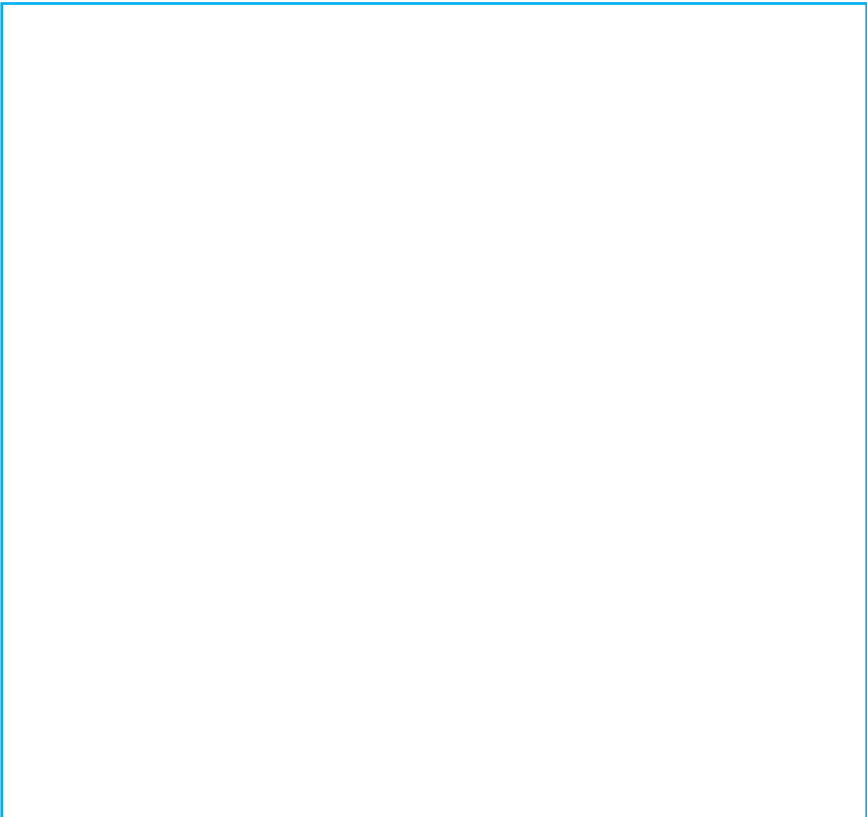
